### **Program Narrative**

The City of Charlottesville proposes to utilize funding from the *2017 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)'s Local Solicitation* to fund the below police equipment qualifying under the "*Law Enforcement Programs*" Purpose Area.

The programs will require little coordination, and will mostly involve limited coordination between the City's Police and Purchasing Departments. The Police Department is prepared to immediately expend the funds upon receipt of the JAG award and upon receipt of an appropriation by Charlottesville City Council.

The Charlottesville Police Department is an accredited agency by the Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission and the Department strives to be a leader and model organization for other law enforcement agencies to follow and emulate. The City of Charlottesville will create a unique internal order (account) in its financial management system (SAP) to separately track all financial activities of the grant. This will result in all grant drawdowns and expenditures being tracked separately from all other city funds.

1. **Interactive Smart Boards**

The Charlottesville Police Department will use funding to purchase two new interactive smart boards. The addition of this technology will allow for better dissemination of vital information for planning operations. They will also be utilized by Executive Staff for strategic planning.
